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





Percentage of Population




Highlights

- Definitions, interpretations vary as well


Current Metrics

2008/2009 Per Capita Rates






Current Metrics 2009/2010 Per Capita Rates

Who's Paying?

- Manufacturers (other than CA)
 - Return Share or Returns
 - Market Share or Sales Weight
- Why is this Important?
 - Determines who pays, how much
 - Determines who recyclers need to contract with
- Why the variation?
 - Some political, some adaptation over time



The Need

- Regular forum for info exchange
 - Away from infrequent conference sessions, exaggerations of legislative battles
- Learn from previous states
 - "Home" for knowledge base
- Method for identifying and reducing overlap
 - Saves government and stakeholder resources
- Formal process for making decisions
 - i.e. new products, gray areas



NERC Northeast Recycling Council



- Forum for coordination and joint decision-making
- Modeled on Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse
- Members
 - Voting: State/local government 11 and others pending
 - Affiliate: industry, non-profits, state/local without legislation, trade associations - 15



Benefits of ERCC

- Reduce administrative overlap
- One-stop shop for information on state laws
- Coordinate data gathering/info sharing
- Formalize joint (but non-binding) responses on key implementation issues
- Specialized research
- Stakeholders affected by laws working together with administrators
 - Greater understanding of challenges each side faces

Activities of ERCC

- Ultimately decided by Executive Committee based on member (including Affiliate) input
- Initial activities
 - Manufacturer tracking database and consolidated registration system
 - Market share data gathering and access
 - Coordinated responses to non-compliant companies and common questions
 - Data tracking of performance measures



Electronics Recycling Coordination Clearinghouse

The mission of the Electronics Recycling Coordination Clearinghouse is to provide a forum for information exchange among state agencies implementing electronics recycling laws and all impacted stakeholders.



The Electronics Recycling Coordination Clearinghouse (ERCC) was launched in 2010 by two leading non-profit organizations advancing recycling efforts across the country - the National Center for Electronics Recycling (NCER) and the Northeast Recycling Council (NERC). The ERCC is a forum for coordination and information exchange among the state/local agencies that are implementing electronics recycling laws and all impacted stakeholders.

The ERCC is divided into two basic types of membership. The first are the voting members, who are states and local governments that are implementing electronics recycling laws. The ERCC also includes an affiliate, non-voting membership consisting of industry and other organizations. The ERCC is modeled on the successful organization currently managed by NERC known as the Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse (TPCH). TPCH has demonstrated over the years that providing this type of coordination can provide benefits

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




Disposal Bans




3 without program laws, 6 without bans but program laws



Manufacturer pays registration fee and for collection and recycling of covered electronic devices based on their yearly sales to households

LBS. SOLD SHARE

Manufacturers are a assigned a market share percentage based on total weight sold into the state. A separate per



RETURNS 1 - Manufacturers must develop and implement their own recycling programs for their own returned products. MI has voluntary market weight-based goal

RETURNS + TV MARKET SHARE- IT Manufacturers pay for costs of their own branded products collected plus a pro rata share of orphan products. TV manufacturers pay based on their market share percentage of all TVs returned.
